



# Basics

It is assumed that you already know how to setup and install Drupal as well as configure basic parts of your installation. We will start at the screen shown below.



When you click “Administer” you will be brought to the administration page which will look similar to the following image.



You are concerned with the “Site Building” section right now. Click the “Themes” link to be brought to our next page.

## Themes

Select which themes are available to your users and specify the default theme. To configure site-wide display settings, click the "configure" task above. Alternatively, to override these settings in a specific theme, click the "configure" link for that theme. Note that different themes may have different regions available for displaying content; for consistency in presentation, you may wish to enable only one theme.

To change the appearance of your site, a number of [contributed themes](#) are available.

Now we're on to installing the theme.



## Configuration

Now that you have installed the theme, you will want to configure it. This theme used to have many more options for configuration but these bloated options have since moved into nicer and smaller modules.

Click the “Configure” link at the top of the “Themes” page. You will now see options for your default, previous, and current theme.



Click “Ubuntu Drupal Theme” and you will see a page similar to the following.



If you scroll down to the bottom, you will see the “Theme Specific Options.” These options apply to this theme only. Although an option does not yet exist to show/hide the breadcrumb, it will exist soon enough.

### Theme-specific settings

These settings only exist for the *Ubuntu Drupal Theme* theme and all the styles based on it.

#### Page Options

**Page Width (default=960):****Width Type:** px %

Size the page using either pixels or percent.

**Footer Text (Right):**Ubuntu Drupal</a> team."/>

If you'd like to change the width to something like 90%, you can do so with the following.
